

Saugatuck Township Recycling Guide

Help our communities reduce contamination by remembering:

Don't bag your recycles. **EMPTY. CLEAN. DRY.**

When in doubt, throw it out.

PAPER & CARDBOARD

Recycle office papers, junk mail, file folders, newspapers, greeting cards, magazines, catalogs, corregated boxes and containers, cereal, pasta and food boxes without a wax coating. Clean pizza boxes are fine, (no food residue or oil). Please flatten all cardboard.

NOTE: Shredded paper, napkins and paper towels cannot be recycled curbside.



PLASTICS

Recycle plastics #1 & 2 through the Back to Basics Program. Look on the bottom of the container for the number inside the recycling triangle. Clean out contents, let them dry and toss into the bin. Leave caps on, once container is dry, if plastic.

NOTE: Straws and fexible produce, grocery or bags of any kind cannot be recycled curbside, they get caught in the sorting equuipment. Best to skip taking a bag at the checkout!



GLASS

Glass jars & bottles. No mixed materials or pyrex glass please.



Recycle all food and beverage metal cans - steel, tin and aluminum. Clean aluminum foil, pans and pie tins (no residue). Please remove all labels.
